Otago-Southland Model United Nations 2018 is the flagship secondary schools event of UN Youth Otago, attracting over 100 students from across the region.

Model United Nations conferences are the 'flagship' event of UN Youth New Zealand for a reason. These events are an educational tool to develop the skills, confidence and knowledge of high school students on vital international issues.

Students are given the opportunity to research their assigned country and debate from their perspective in a similar structure to the real United Nations. This immersive experience teaches students about the complexities of multilateral discussions and develops their perspective on the world, and their place in it. Model UN helps develop useful and widely applicable skills such as:

- Public speaking
- Critical thinking
- Research
- Negotiation
- Open-mindedness

These educational outcomes are not just for high school students. Volunteering as part of the organising committee is a rewarding experience where volunteers learn leadership and organisational skills in a team environment. You will get to work with passionate, like-minded volunteers while developing a conference promoting valuable civics education, networking and negotiation skills – and learn a lot along the way!

The conference is run over two days with workshops, committee sessions, guest speakers and a social event. The Coordinator and their Committee choose the theme and educational goals of the conference, and then make that dream a reality! Support and training will be provided by the Otago Regional Council.

- Manages delegate and conference assistant registrations
- First line of communication with delegates and conference assistants
- Organises guest speakers
